The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.



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AFRICA

Libya: UNSMIL: SG to report to SC on the implementation of resolution 2755 (2024)

Resolution 2755 (2024) of 31 October 2024

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution every 60 days;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2024.

Sudan: Sanctions: 1591 Committee reports

Resolution 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2005

Para. 3: Decides, in light of the failure of all parties to the conflict in Darfur to fulfil their commitments,

(a) to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council (herein "the Committee"), to undertake to following tasks:

iv. to report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work.

The Chair of the Committee is expected to report in December 2024.

AMERICAS

Colombia: SG to report on Verification Mission

Resolution 2366 (2017) of 10 July 2017

Para. 8: Further requests the Secretary-General, based on the reporting of the Special Representative, to report to the Security Council on the implementation of the Verification Mission's mandate every 90 days after the start of its verification activities;

Resolution 2545 (2020) of 25 September 2020

Para. 1: Decides to extend, to 25 September 2021, the mandate of the Verification Mission and reporting requirements in accordance with its resolutions 2366 (2017), 2377 (2017), 2435 (2018) and 2487 (2019), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations;

Resolution 2574 (2021) of 11 May 2021

Para. 3: Welcomes the Secretary-General's proposal to incorporate reporting with respect to the verification of compliance with the sentences referred to in paragraph 1 of this resolution within the existing reporting cycle for the Verification Mission, and to keep the Council fully informed of the preparations of the Verification Mission and the progress, assessment, and eventual results of the verification;

Afghanistan: SG reports on UNAMA

Para. 5: Requests that the Secretary-General reports to the Council every three months on the situation in Afghanistan and the implementation of UNAMA's mandate, including at the subnational level;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2024.

Iraq: SG to prepare a transition and liquidation plan for UNAMI

Para. 2: Requests that the Secretary-General prepare, in consultation with the Government of Iraq, a transition and liquidation plan to be completed by 31 December 2024, for UNAMI to start the transfer of its tasks, as well as the orderly and safe drawdown and withdrawal of its personnel and assets, including identification of an end date for liquidation activities in Iraq;

Para. 12: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on the implementation of the provisions of the present resolution;

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question: Requests the Senior Humanitarian and reconstruction Coordinator appointed by UNSCR 2720 (2023) to report on UN mechanism for accelerating aid to Gaza

Resolution 2720 (2023) of 22 December 2023

Para. 6: Determines that the Coordinator will have the necessary personnel and equipment in Gaza, under the authority of the United Nations, to perform these, and other functions as determined by the Security Council, and requests that the Coordinator report to the Security Council on its work, with an initial report within 20 days and thereafter every 90 days through 30 September 2024;

PSC letter of 30 September 2024 (S/2024/706)

I have the honor to inform you that the members of the Security Council request that the Senior Humanitarian and Reconstruction Coordinator continues reporting to the Council on the implementation of her mandate, as stipulated in the resolution 2720 (2023), for an additional period of six months, through 31 March 2025.

Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution 2118 (2013)

Para. 12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report on the implementation of resolution 2201 (2015) and on developments in Yemen

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report on the implementation of this resolution, and to continue to report on developments in Yemen, including on the implementation of the Gulf Cooperation Council Initiative and its Implementation Mechanism, the outcomes of the comprehensive National Dialogue conference, and the Peace and National Partnership Agreement and its security annex within 15 days after the date of adoption of this resolution and every 60 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in December 2024.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC under resolution 2722 (2024)

Resolution 2739 (2024) of 27 June 2024 Para. 1: Extends the reporting request in paragraph 10 of resolution 2722 (2024) until January 15, 2025;

Resolution 2722 (2024) of 10 January 2024

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General provide written monthly reports, through July 1, 2024, to the Security Council on any further Houthi attacks on merchant and commercial vessels in the Red Sea to inform the Council's future consultations;

1988 Committee: Sanctions: Emergency Relief Coordinator to brief the Council on the delivery of humanitarian assistance in Afghanistan

Para. 2: Requests the Emergency Relief Coordinator to brief the Security Council every six months from the adoption of this resolution based on the delivery of humanitarian assistance in Afghanistan including on any available information regarding payments of funds to, or for the benefit of, designated individuals or entities, any diversion of funds by the same, risk management and due diligence processes in place, and any obstacles to the provision of such assistance, and further requests relevant providers to assist the Emergency Relief Coordinator in the preparation of such briefings by providing information relevant to paragraph 1 above within 60 days of any such provision;

The Emergency Relief Coordinator is expected to brief in December 2024.

Non-proliferation (Iran): Joint Commission reports

JCPOA Annex IV – Joint Commission para. 6.10.: The Joint Commission will report to the United Nations Security Council at least every 6 months on the status of the Procurement Working Group's decisions and on any implementation issues.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The Joint Commission is expected to report in December 2024.

Non-proliferation (Iran): Facilitator to brief the other members of the SC

Note by the PSC of 16 January 2016

Para. 3: To facilitate its work under resolution 2231 (2015), the Security Council shall select on an annual basis one member to serve as its facilitator for the functions specified in the present note. The facilitator shall brief the other members of the Council on its work and the implementation of the

resolution every six months, in parallel with the report submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with paragraph 7 below.

Facilitator's proposal as agreed on 17 March 2017

The facilitator is expected to brief in December 2024.

Non-proliferation (Iran): SG reports on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015) Note by the PSC of 16 January 2016

Para. 7: The Security Council requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council every six months on the implementation of resolution 2231 (2015). Prior to the public release of that report, the Security Council shall meet informally, normally at the expert level, to review the findings and recommendations contained in the report.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in December 2024.

Residual Mechanism: Annual report
