April 2025 at a Glance



Key Topics

Ukraine (8, 17 and 29/30 April) and Sudan and South Sudan (15, 16 and 30 April) were the most frequently considered country- or region-specific items in open and closed discussions, followed by the Middle East (10 and 25 April), and the Middle East, including the Palestinian question (3 and 29/30 April). Other country or region-specific items considered by the Council included: Colombia, Great Lakes, Haiti, Libya, Myanmar, Peace Consolidation in West Africa, Somalia, United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) and Western Sahara. On 11 April, Council members held an informal interactive dialogue on the situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. On 14 April, the Council held a private meeting with troopcontributing countries on the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS).

Under thematic items, the Council held meetings on Non-proliferation, Protection of civilians in armed conflict, and United Nations Peacekeeping Operations. On 28 April, the Council heard its annual briefing by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). Under other matters (AOB), Council members discussed the chairs

On 21 April, prior to the meeting held under the item entitled "The question concerning Haiti", Council members observed a **minute of silence** in remembrance of the passing of His Holiness Pope Francis.

Decisions and press statements

In April 2025, the Council adopted one resolution and issued three press statements.

On 30 April, acting under Chapter VII, the Council unanimously adopted resolution 2778 (2025), extending the mandate of the **United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS)** until 9 May 2026

The Council issued three press statements on Myanmar (SC/16038), Sudan (SC/16046) and on the terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir (SC/16050).

Other activities

On 2, 4 and 23 April, Council members convened four Arria-formula meetings respectively on: **"Disinformation and Sabotage of Peace in Ukraine"** organized by the Russian Federation; **"Small Arms Control and Weapons Management in UN Sanctions Regimes"** organized by Sierra Leone and cosponsored by Algeria, Guyana, and Somalia; **"Harnessing Safe, Inclusive, Trustworthy Artificial Intelligence for International Peace & Security"** organized by Greece, France, Republic of Korea, and cosponsored by Armenia, Italy, and the Netherlands; and **"The Impact of Unilateralism and Bullying Practices on International Relations"**, organized by China.
