AFRICA

Libya: UNSMIL: SG to report to SC on the implementation of resolution [2755 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2755 \(2024\)](#) of 31 October 2024

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution every 60 days;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

Libya: Sanctions: SG to report to SC on the implementation of UNSCR [2733 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2733 \(2024\)](#) of 31 May 2024

Para. 5: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council within six months and eleven months of the adoption of this resolution on its implementation; [Libya sanctions vessel inspection: resolution [2292 \(2016\)](#)]

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

Somalia: UNSOS: Independent strategic review

Resolution [2767 \(2024\)](#) of 27 December 2024

Para. 44: Requests the Secretary-General, in consultation with the African Union Commission Chairperson, Somalia and international stakeholders, to carry out and submit to the Security Council and the General Assembly, by 1 April 2025, an independent strategic review of UNSOS, to enable the potential implementation of the framework established by resolution [2719 \(2023\)](#) to AUSSOM from 1 July 2025 from within existing resources made available by the rightsizing of UNSOS, including the development of detailed recommendations for the optimisation of UNSOS's efficiency, performance, management and structures in the context of the authorisation of AUSSOM, and an assessment of the potential operational implications for support to AUSSOM's activities, as well as proposed mitigations;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

South Sudan: SG report on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and obstructions

Resolution [2729 \(2024\)](#) of 29 April 2024

Para. 24: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and the obstructions UNMISS encounters in doing so in a comprehensive written report to be submitted within 90 days of the date of adoption of this resolution, every 90 days thereafter, and underscores that such reporting should provide integrated, evidence-based and data-driven analysis, strategic assessments and frank advice to the Security Council and should include attention to: [...]

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

Western Sahara: SG to brief the SC on the status and progress of negotiations, the implementation of resolution 2756 (2024), challenges to MINURSO operations and steps taken to address them
Resolution 2756 (2024) of 31 October 2024

Para 11: Requests the Secretary-General to brief the Security Council on a regular basis, and at any time he deems appropriate during the mandate period, to include within six months of this mandate's renewal and again prior to its expiration, on the status and progress of these negotiations under his auspices, on the implementation of this resolution, assessment of MINURSO's operations and steps taken to address challenges, expresses its intention to meet to receive and discuss his briefings and in this regard, further requests the Secretary-General to provide a report on the situation in Western Sahara well before the end of the mandate period;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2025.

AMERICAS

Haiti: SG reports on BINUH on the implementation of resolution 2743 (2024)
Resolution 2743 (2024) of 12 July 2024

Para. 1: Decides to extend, to 15 July 2025 the mandate of BINUH in accordance with its resolution 2476 (2019), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and the reporting requirements as specified in paragraph 1 of resolution 2645 (2022);
The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

Resolution 2751 (2024) of 30 September 2024

Para. 1: Decides to extend the present mandate of the MSS mission, as authorized in resolution 2699 (2023), to October 2, 2025, and reiterates the call to Haiti and the leadership of the MSS mission to update regularly the Security Council and the Secretary-General of the progress of deployment;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

Haiti: UNODC to report to the SC through the SG on illicit arms and financial flows
Resolution 2743 (2024) of 12 July 2024

Para. 19: Requests BINUH to work with UNODC and other relevant UN agencies to support Haitian authorities in combating illicit trafficking and diversion of arms and related materiel as well as illicit financial flows and in enhancing management and control of borders and ports and to include the progress of relevant work in the Secretary-General's regular report to the Security Council, and further commends the quarterly report of UNODC to the Security Council, concurrent with the reporting cycle of BINUH, through the Secretary-General, and in this regard reiterates its request to UNODC to continue its quarterly update which shall continue to focus on sources and routes of illicit arms and financial flows, relevant UN activities and recommendations;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

ASIA/MIDDLE EAST

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question
Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2025.

Middle East (Lebanon): SG reports on resolution 1559 (2004)

Resolution 1559 (2004) of 2 September 2004

Para. 7: Requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council within thirty days on the implementation by the parties of this resolution and decides to remain actively seized of the matter.

S/PRST/2004/36 of 19 October 2004

Last para.: The Security Council appreciates the Secretary-General's intention to keep the Council updated. It requests that he continue to report on the implementation of the resolution to the Council every six months.

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2025.

Middle East (Syria): SG report on the implementation of resolution 2268 (2016)

Resolution 2268 (2016) of 26 February 2016

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including by drawing on information provided by the ISSG ceasefire taskforce, and on resolution 2254 (2015), within 15 days of the adoption of this resolution and every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2025.

Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution 2118 (2013)

Resolution 2118 (2013) of 27 September 2013

Para. 12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The report is expected to be issued in April 2025.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution 2742 (2024)

Resolution 2742 (2024) of 8 July 2024

Para. 2: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, in accordance with paragraph 8 of resolution 2643 (2022);

Resolution 2643 (2022) of 13 July 2022

Para. 8: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, including, inter alia on any obstructions to the effective operation of UNMHA caused by any party, any violations of the Hodeidah Agreement ceasefire, any attempts to bring any military reinforcements and military objects to and through the city, the ports of Hodeidah, Salif, and Ras Issa, and the governorate, any failures to remove any military manifestations from the city, and on resolution 2451 (2018), including on any non-compliance by any party;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2025.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC under resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2768 \(2025\)](#) of 15 January 2025

Para. 1: Extends the reporting request in paragraph 10 of resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#) until July 15, 2025;

Resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#) of 10 January 2024

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General provide written monthly reports, through July 1, 2024, to the Security Council on any further Houthi attacks on merchant and commercial vessels in the Red Sea to inform the Council's future consultations;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in April 2025.

EUROPE

UNMIK: SG briefings and concurrent reports to SC

Resolution [1244 \(1999\)](#) of 10 June 1999

Para. 20: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council at regular intervals on the implementation of this resolution, including reports from the leaderships of the international civil and security presences, the first reports to be submitted within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution;

Note by the PSC of 7 February 2019 ([S/2019/120](#))

The members of the Security Council have agreed upon a schedule of meetings on UNMIK, with concurrent Secretary-General reports to the Council. In 2019, the Council intends to hold briefings on 7 February, in June, and in October. As of 2020, the Council intends to hold briefings twice a year (in April and October) on the issue. The Council will continue to review this issue, taking into account the situation on the ground.

The Secretary-General is expected to report in April 2025.
