33. Briefings

During the period under review, the Security Council received eight briefings that were not explicitly connected to any specific item before it.

Four meetings were held under the item entitled "Briefings by Chairs of subsidiary bodies of the Security Council";⁹⁹ at those meetings the Chairs of various sanctions and counter-terrorism committees and working groups provided an overview of the work of their organs to the Council, including the cooperation among the committees in addressing the evolving threat posed by terrorism. Two meetings were held under the item entitled "Briefing by the Chairperson-in-Office of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe", at which the Chairperson-in-Office of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe briefed the Council on the security priorities of that organization, its activities in de-escalating emerging crises and resolving protracted conflicts, and its collaboration with the United Nations, in particular in combating terrorism.

Two briefings were given at closed meetings by the President of the International Court of Justice.

35. The promotion and strengthening of the rule of law in the maintenance of international peace and security

During the period under review, the Security Council held two meetings in connection with the item entitled "The promotion and strengthening of the rule of law in the maintenance of international peace and security", and issued one presidential statement.

The Council in its statement reaffirmed its commitment to international law and the Charter of the United Nations and to an international order based on the rule of law and international law, and underscored that sustainable peace required an integrated approach based on coherence between political, security, development, human rights, including gender equality, and the rule of law and justice activities.¹⁰¹ The Council also noted the recommendation of the Secretary-General on measuring the effectiveness of the support provided by the United Nations system for the promotion of the rule of law in conflict and postconflict situations.¹⁰²
