40. Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security

During the period under review, the Security Council held four meetings and issued two presidential statements in connection with the item entitled "Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security". The Council discussed the partnership between and among the United Nations, the European Union and the African Union in various issues relating to the maintenance of international peace and security, including the emerging migrant crisis.¹¹⁴

The Council on 14 February 2014 issued its first presidential statement concerning cooperation between the United Nations and the European Union; in it the Council commended the involvement of the European Union in international negotiations and mediation, its ongoing commitment to international peacekeeping, peacebuilding, humanitarian assistance and financial as well as logistical support, and its role in supporting the United Nations operations in the areas of mutual concern.¹¹⁵ In another presidential statement, the Council acknowledged the role of the African Union in efforts to prevent or settle conflicts on the African continent, and commended the increased contribution of the African Union to the maintenance of peace and security, including peacekeeping; the Council also welcomed the continued cooperation between the two organizations on different components of the African Peace and Security Architecture.¹¹⁶
