### What is the Procurement Channel?

- The Procurement Channel **reviews proposals** by States seeking to participate in and permit certain transfers of nuclear or dual-use goods, technology, and/ or related services to Iran.
- **States submit proposals** to the Security Council.
- The Procurement Working Group of the Joint Commission will then **assess the application** and **provide a recommendation** to the Security Council.
- The Security Council will **decide** on the basis of this recommendation and **inform the State** about its decision.



#### Stages: dual-use nuclear export to Iran

#### First contacts and expression of interest

Interested companies in exporting state and Iranian importers. Procedures at national level in exporting country and in Iran

End-use certifications are issued for the end-user (importing company) by the Atomic Energy Organisation of Iran (AEIO) for nuclear use goods and by the Ministry of Industry, Mine and Trade for non-nuclear use goods.

Exporting company submits export application to the national Export Control Authority with all necessary documents. Submission to UNSC and analysis by the PWG/Final decision by the SC

Exporting state authorities finalise the file and submit it via established diplomatic channels to the UNSC

UNSC directs file to the Joint Commission for analysis and recommendation. The Procurement Working Group of the Joint Commission reviews the application and provides a recommendation to the Security Council

UNSC takes final decision and informs exporting state.

National Export Control Authority grants approval. Exporting company proceeds with the transfer to Iran.

**Translation**, if needed, before review by the Procurement Working Group by the UN Secretariat.

#### The procurement channel generally covers:

- Supply, sale or transfer of
  - nuclear (NSG Part 1- trigger list) and dual-use (NSG Part 2 dual use list, when for nuclear and non-nuclear civilian end-uses) items and technology
- Provision to Iran of
  - technical assistance, training , financial assistance, investment, brokering or other services related to the supply, sale, transfer, manufacture, or use of nuclear and dual-use goods
- Acquisition by Iran of
  - interest in certain commercial nuclear-related activity in another State involving uranium mining or production or use of certain nuclear materials and technologies and certain related investments



- The supply, sale or transfer of
  - any further items if the relevant state determines that they could contribute to activities inconsistent with the JCPOA (**catch all**)
- Also subject to procurement mechanism
  - Hot cells,
  - shielded cells or
  - shielded glove boxes

#### **Civil nuclear cooperation**

• If States plan to transfer NSG – listed items, goods, technology under the framework of IAEA technical cooperation project or through civil nuclear cooperation projects, such transfers still need to be submitted to the UNSC for approval before they are transferred, even if the IAEA supports the projects.



### **Notification requirements**

- For any items, materials, equipment, goods and technology that are approved by the Security Council the proposing State needs to notify the supply, sale or transfer to the **Security Council** within ten days of the supply, sale or transfer.
- In the case of supplied items, materials, equipment, goods and technology listed in the referenced INFCIRCs, the proposing State also needs to notify the IAEA within ten days of the supply, sale or transfer.

### **End-use verification**

- **State** responsible for the end-use verification of non-nuclear related items, materials, goods and technology;
- **IAEA** responsible for the end-use verification of nuclear related items, materials, goods and technology;

#### **Exemptions**

- For light water reactors
- Goods, technology and services directly related to
  - stable isotope production at the Fordow facility;
  - export of Iran's enriched uranium in excess of 300 kg in return for natural uranium;
  - modernization of the Arak research reactor;

According to Annex B of UNSR 2231, other requirements, such as **notification to the Security Council and/or the Joint Commission**, must however be fulfilled!

- Disapproved proposals can be resubmitted

- Proposals reviewed and approved
- Confidentiality: statement published, electronic database launched
- Documentation, forms, explanatory notes: published and updated
- Outreach: ongoing activities
- Reports to UNSC: submitted every six months
